- Learn how to use digital technology to empower students and encourage them to become active citizens by using digital technology in a meaningful way



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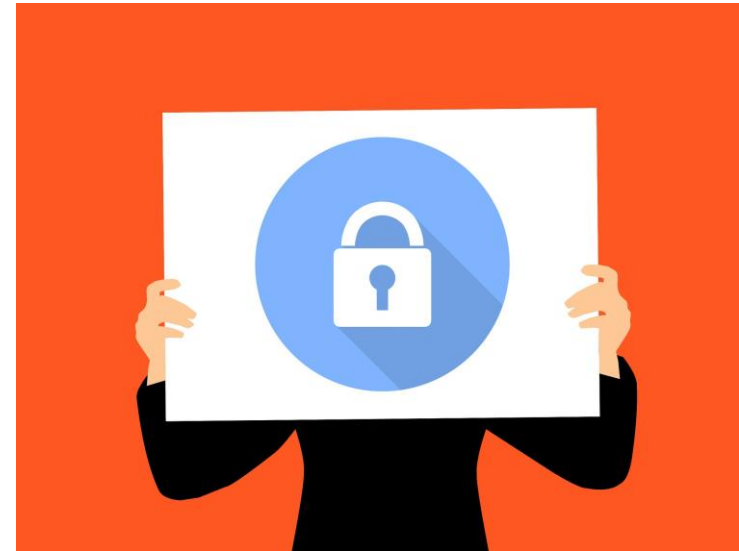

UNDERSTAND WHAT NETIQUETTE IS AND WHY IT IS IMPORTANT

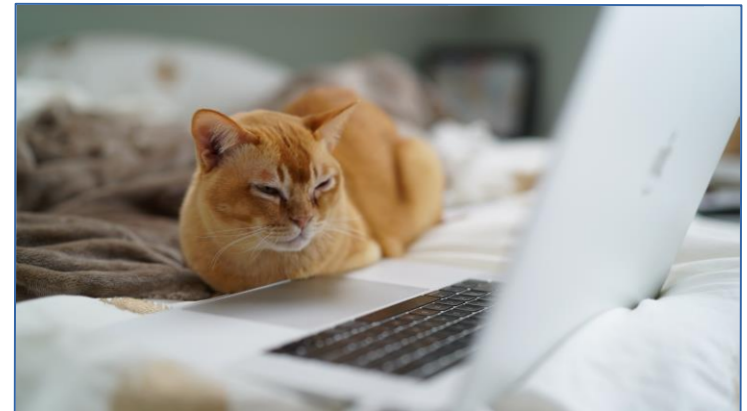
Being a form of communication and an extension of society, the Internet also needs its own etiquette.

NETIQUETTE is a combination of two words network and etiquette and it can be understood as the do's and don'ts of online communication.

It can be sometimes difficult to fully understand something someone else has typed. It does not allow us to see facial expressions, body language, or hear intonation. As a result, messages can often be misinterpreted.

By following the basic rules of netiquette, online communication becomes clearer, more constructive and polite.

Netiquette helps you develop and maintain positive online relationships and a good reputation.

BE FAMILIAR WITH THE BASIC RULES OF NETIQUETTE

The etiquette expected from the students in online communication is the same as the one expected in a classroom.

Here are some guidelines every netizen needs to know and use:

- **#1** The manners your parents taught you also apply online.
- **#2** Pay attention to proper punctuation, spelling and grammar.
- **#3** Be careful before you post any content online.
- **#4** Always be polite and understanding in your online interactions.
- **#5** Promote healthy and honest discussions

LEARN HOW TO REACT TO BREAKING THE RULES OF NETIQUETTE

The rules of netiquette can be broken in variety of ways. One example of bad netiquette is hate speech, which can be defined as abusive or threatening speech directed towards a person or a group because of their race, religion, or sexual orientation. Here are some suggestions for students on how to react to hate speech:

#punish

#report

#block/delete

#ignore

LEARN HOW TO REACT TO BREAKING THE RULES OF NETIQUETTE

#punish

The law makes it clear that insulting and directing threats to another person is illegal both on the Internet and in real life.



#report

If you feel you are a victim of hate speech, you can report it to the website administrator by asking them to remove the offending content.

LEARN HOW TO REACT TO BREAKING THE RULES OF NETIQUETTE

#block/delete

One way of dealing with hate speech online is by simply deleting the offending comments and block the user.



#ignore

Ignoring hate speech completely can be one of the ways you can deal with it.

#inform

Share with a person you trust, like a family member, a colleague teacher or a friend so they can advise you what to do.



#educate

Take time to understand the definition and study some examples of hate speech which appear online.

#react

Do not remain quiet, speak up!



#create

Every act of kindness online is another step in creating an alternative for hate speech.

SUMMARY

Netiquette is not just a fancy word, it has become a code of conduct in online communication. Netiquette refers to a set of good manners and social conventions practised online and it helps develop and maintain positive online relationships.

If you are on social media, and you are not learning, not laughing, not being inspired or not networking, then you are using it wrong.

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Don't promote negativity online and expect people to treat you with positivity in person.

What you post online speaks VOLUMES about who you really are. POST with intention. REPOST with caution.

~

Freedom of Speech doesn't justify online bullying. Words have power, be careful how you use them.

~

Use social media for good and lift others up, not tear them down. Stay on the high road. Keep your peace.

~

Think before you click. If people do not know you personally and if they cannot see you as you type, what you post online can be taken out of context if you are not careful in the way your message is delivered.
